YMCA Dulverton Group provides a comprehensive range of services and support to communities across Weston-super-Mare, Bridgwater and West Somerset. With young people at the heart of their mission, the organisation is dedicated to creating transformed communities where young people can belong, contribute and thrive.

The YMCA Dulverton Group's community hub houses multiple services including temporary emergency accommodation for young people, a Youth Café that operates six days a week as a dropin center, shared and studio flat accommodation for young people, community meeting spaces and dedicated meeting and training rooms.

The organisation's meal provision project targets individuals experiencing life crises, including homelessness, benefit reductions, independent living without family support and low-income situations. Through this initiative, YMCA Dulverton Group aims to provide essential nutritional support to those facing difficult circumstances.

Aldi's food donations make a much needed difference to our services. With soaring living costs, we have seen an increase in demand for support, as many young people are struggling and skipping meals to be able to sustain their accommodation.

We've also seen an increase in UACS (unaccompanied) young people coming into our care. With Aldi's food donations, we are able to meet their religious needs by providing them with appropriate food offerings. All of the young people in our service have not had the best upbringings and many are traumatised after making long, dangerous journeys from their home countries.

We use Aldi's donations to provide cooking on a budget sessions, teaching young people to make nutritious meals, which is very important for their development needs. We also run a food bank, which has allowed us to foster community spirit as young people like to make meals for each other.
